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Dr. Robert Johnson 'Forensic Dentistry'

Course Objective:

To educate dentists, staff and other professionals concerning the use, scope and science of forensic dentistry. To help dental professionals understand their potential role in forensic dentistry.

At the end of the program participants should be able to:

- Understand the basic areas of Forensic Dentistry and recognize the role that it has in the legal system.
- Learn the basics of dental identification and understand forensic dentistry's role in mass fatalities cases, including the use of the WIN-ID computer system.

Robert C. Johnson, DDS, is currently the Forensic Odontologist for the Mahoning County Coroner and a core team member on the ODA's Forensic Dental Team. He earned a B.S. degree from Youngstown State and his DDS from The Ohio State University College of Dentistry.

He served on the active clinical staff at St. Elizabeth Hospital Medical Center from 1981-1992 and is the chairman of Communications, Forensic Dental Team and Mass Fatality Team for CPDS. Dr. Johnson has presented forensic lectures and workshops at the ODA Annual Session; to dental and medical residents; several Ohio dental societies, dental hygiene and Dental Assisting students, and to local area police agencies.
