'Be Aware of Wear: A Systematic Approach to Diagnosing, Treatment Planning, and Restoring the Worn Dentition' and 'To Smile or not to Smile: Why Truly Understanding Smile Design Principles is so Important to you and Your Patient'



Friday, September 20, 2019

Course Objective: In today's society tooth wear is more prevalent than ever and it is therefore incumbent upon the entire dental team to be well versed in recognizing the clinical signs of wear while understanding the importance of prevention when possible and the restorative options when necessary.

Learning Objective:

- Recognize the clinical signs of intrinsic and extrinsic erosion.
- Office protocols to help patients prevent and/or treat acid erosion.
- Designing an occlusal scheme that fits the grinding patterns of the patient.
- Bite opening vs. crown lengthening vs. orthodontic intrusion to gain space for restorations.
- A systematic approach in the treatment of simple to complex wear cases.

Course Objective: Today patients seeking aesthetic procedures and smile makeover have high expectations. In order to meet patient demands, we must summon both our artistic and scientific skills, combining a thorough understanding of smile design principles in order to achieve the desired results. Also included in the presentation will be the importance of composite mock-ups, provisional restorations, laboratory communication, and multidisciplinary teamwork.

Learning Objective:

- Why incisal edge position is so important and how to determine it.
- Visualization, preparation, and communication with composite mock-ups.
- How to evaluate provisional aesthetically, functionally and phonetically to insure clinical success.
- How to prevent or eliminate dark triangles.
- The importance of the relationship between the teeth, gingival scaffold, and lips.

Thomas E. Dudney, DMD is a 1977 graduate of University of the Alabama at Birmingham School of Dentistry. He has served as the Clinical Director for the Aesthetic Advantage hands-on programs taught by Dr. Larry Rosenthal at New York University and the Eastman Dental Clinic in London. He was the clinical Director for the California Center for Advanced Dental Studies (CCADS) live patient hands-on programs taught in the US, Canada, and the UK. Presently he is the clinical director for the newly formed Pacific Aesthetic Continuum (PAC) hands-on programs. He has presented workshops and lectures at dental meetings around the country and authored several articles on aesthetic and restorative dentistry.

How to reach Holiday Inn Boardman from:

Pittsburgh and points east: Pa. Turnpike to Ohio Turnpike Exit 1; I-680 North to U.S. 224 (to Canfield); west to second light, at South Avenue; turn left. Holiday Inn Boardman is ¼ mile on the right.

Cleveland and points west: Ohio Turnpike east to Exit 218 toward Youngstown. Merge onto I-680 South via Exit 224B toward Youngstown. Take the US 224 West exit, Exit 11A, toward Canfield. Turn slight right onto Boardman-Poland Road (US 224). Turn left onto South Avenue. Holiday Inn Boardman is ¼ mile on the right.

Ashtabula and points north: Route 11 south toward Youngstown, Merge onto OH-711 South to I-680 south. Take I-680 to US 224 West exit, EXIT 11A, toward Canfield. Turn slight right onto Boardman- Poland Road (US 224). Turn left onto South Avenue. Holiday Inn Boardman is ¼ mile on the right.

Columbus and points south: Route I-71 to I-76 East. Take I-80 east toward Youngstown/New York City. Merge onto I-680 south via EXIT 224B toward Youngstown. Take US 224 west, EXIT 11A, toward Canfield. Turn slightly onto Boardman-Canfield Road, US 224. Turn left onto South Avenue. Holiday Inn Boardman is ¼ mile on the right.

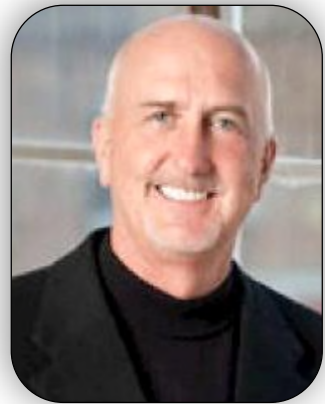
