- 7. The location, use, removal, handling, decontamination and disposal of personal protective equipment,
- 8. How to select appropriate personal protective equipment,
- **9.** The effectiveness, safety, benefits and method of administering the hepatitis B vaccine and that it will be provided free of charge,
- 10. What to do if there is an emergency spill of blood or other potentially infectious material,
- 11. What to do if an exposure incident occurs,
- 12. The post-exposure evaluation and follow-up that is to be followed after an exposure incident,
- 13. The system of labels or color-coding used to designate biohazards,
- 14. An explanation of the Ohio EPA infectious waste disposal rules,\*
- **15.** An opportunity for interactive questions and answers.
